USC School of Journalism Holds Forum on Homelessness With The Midnight Mission

Who: USC School of Journalism Students and the Skid Row Community will explore the crisis of

homelessness with a panel of service providers including The Midnight Mission President & CEO G. Michael Arnold, The Midnight Mission Managing Director Clancy Imislund, LAPD Officer Deon Joseph, Mayor Garcetti's Homelessness Policy Director Alisa Orduna and USC's Roy P. Crocker Professor of Law Jody David Armour. The forum will be moderated by USC Annenberg School Professor Sandy Tolan and Associate Professor Mary Murphy, who are teaching a class called "Reporting on Homelessness." Their students – Andres Guzman, Razzan Nakhlawi, Julia Poe, Savanna Robinson, Daniela Silva, Ariel Tu and Ashley Vasquez – are exploring a range of issues facing people experiencing homelessness, with a special focus on innovative, systemic

and practical solutions.

What: The class approached The Midnight Mission with the hope of holding a public forum that would

be open to people experiencing homelessness and to those who work with the homeless population. What will be unique about this forum is that the voices of the homeless community and those who have made it out of Skid Row will be heard. We will ask them for their suggestions, encourage them to discuss their concerns and find out what *they* see as solutions. The USC students participating in the forum will also be covering the event for the USC media outlets.

When: Thursday, October 5, 2017, from 2:00 pm to 3:30 pm

Why: Since homelessness in Los Angeles is a top priority at the University of Southern California, USC

Associate Professor Mary Murphy and USC Professor Sandy Tolan decided to teach a class about how journalists do and should cover this burgeoning crisis in our city. Murphy and Tolan are multi-

media journalists who work in print, radio and on television.

How: The event will be hosted at The Midnight Mission and is free of charge to anyone who wishes to

attend.
