## Alumni Spotlight Robert S.



There is a moment many of us know, when it becomes clear something has to change. For Robert, he reached a point where he knew he had two choices: get well or die. He chose to live.

Drugs and alcohol strained his relationships and left him feeling completely disconnected, even from his own family. When Robert first came to The Midnight Mission, he wasn't sure how recovery was possible in that environment. What he found inside was something different: support, structure, and community. With the help of counselors, advocates, and peers, Robert began rebuilding his life.

Today, Robert is celebrating two years of sobriety. He now leads Addicts Helping Addicts (AHA), supporting others on their recovery. He has also been working full-time with Chrysalis for the past 18-months, rebuilding his confidence and sense of purpose. Best of all, his family has welcomed him back. He recently took a trip with his siblings, the same ones who once felt they had lost him. Robert's story is a reminder that recovery is possible, and no matter how far we've gone, there is always a way forward.
